THE Queensland Early Motorcycle Sports Club (QEMSC) ran its annual meeting at Carnell Raceway recently with a strong field of 55 riders.

The class break up was as follows.

Vintage (Period 2) comprised 2 pre 1946 machines, Classic (Period 3) 13 pre 1963 machines, Post Classic (Period 4) 6 pre 73 machines, Forgotten Era (Period 5) 4 pre 1980 machines & 6 sidecars competitors & passengers "swingers". Another 22 machines were nominated in invitation events including 10 in the Superlite/Motolite category & another 12 in the Supermoto/Supermono/Superbike-lite category.

British & Continental motorcycle brands such as Norton, Triumph, Ariel, NSU, Ducati, BSA, ESO, Bultaco & Japanese machines Honda, Kawasaki & Yamaha were all represented along with racing hybrids like Tritons (Norton/Triumph) & Norton/Jap.

This years event was blessed with the most exceptional weather, unlike the last couple of years when it has either been bitterly cold or raining or sleeting or all three at once.
